Collaboration

- The COVID-19 pandemic taught us the importance of virtual meeting tools like <u>Zoom</u> and <u>Microsoft Teams</u> for everyday client meetings or large-scale webinars.
- Google Workspace and Microsoft Sharepoint make document sharing and collaboration a breeze. <u>Dropbox</u> is an effective tool for sharing large-sized files like photos and videos.
- Project management programs like <u>Trello</u>, <u>Monday.com</u> and <u>Asana</u> support planning and execution with tools to manage expectations, set deadlines and hold people accountable.

Marketing

Keep in touch with your audiences through email platforms like <u>MailChimp</u>.
We love this software because it has a free version for up to 500 contacts perfect for those just starting out or growing their audiences. Companies with
larger email lists can look to <u>Constant Contact</u> or <u>HubSpot</u> for more
segmentation options.

- While you can publish and schedule social media posts now directly through Meta Business Suite, tools like <u>Hootsuite</u>, <u>Sendible</u> and <u>Buffer</u> are helpful for managing multiple social media channels and engagement across platforms.
- <u>Canva</u> is an incredible, free **design tool** complete with templates, stock imagery and more. Additionally, Adobe just launched its <u>Express</u> tool that doesn't require a credit card.
- Many of the software listed previously also offer web development features, but if your business needs to sell products or collect donations, you'll want to look at a more robust platform like <u>WooCommerce</u> through <u>WordPress</u>, <u>Wix</u> or a website powered by <u>Square</u>.
- For hosting ticketed events, Eventbrite is our go-to platform.

Financial

- <u>PayPal</u> is one of the most established online credit card processors, and is integrated into many of the services listed previously. <u>Venmo</u> now offers options for businesses to take payment as well.
- For invoicing and tracking expenses, <u>Quickbooks</u> is still the industry standard.
 However there are new, more affordable expense management tools on the scene, like <u>FreshBooks</u> and <u>Expensify</u>.
- Apps like MilelQ and <u>Driversnote</u> provide quick and easy support for mileage tracking.
